## Main Street Project Completion

Just before the new year, the Arboretum's Main Street Project was completed. This experiment is to help us identify possibilities for rejuvenation of the famous Rice hedges. The Main Street Project can be found between entrances 2 and 3. It is most accessible via the outer loop trail.

Development of the Liddell Garden has actively continued with the installation of four benches. Architecture student Sarah Simpson's birdbath sculpture vision is soon to become a reality, along with a special gate to welcome visitors into the garden. The mission of the arboretum is to enhance the beauty of the campus landscape while making it ever more useful for learning. Funding opportunities exist for projects of all sizes. Donations and suggestions are always welcomed.

The Lynn R. Lowrey Arboretum is a teaching and research resource of Rice University. An outdoor classroom spanning the Rice campus, it serves programs from biology to engineering to architecture to literature to interdisciplinary studies on the environment. Dedicated on March 18, 1999, the Arboretum honors the distinguished horticulturist whose life and work were devoted to spreading knowledge and appreciation for the trees and plants of the Gulf Coast of the United States and northern Mexico. The Lowrey Arboretum Collection is a set of woody plants that represents native and introduced species suitable to the soils and climate of the Houston area. At present, the Arboretum collection numbers 84 specimens, representing 76 species catalogued on the Rice grounds. Across campus, some 4,605 trees and shrubs have been recorded representing 128 different species.
